

The Battle of Midway is considered by many experts as the "turning point" of World War II in the Pacific Theater. Whatever we may now consider as genius, strategy, heroics, or errors, all of these decisions were made by individuals with limited information and time. We have the luxury of looking back at the past to evaluate the battle with much of the information easily accessible online and through a multitude of historical sources.

Directions: Read the paragraph "Nagumo's Dilemma" below. Then review the timeline of the Battle of Midway from the Japanese perspective on the next page. Explain which of these moments were responsible for the outcome of the battle.

Admiral Nagumo is in quite the predicament. He is the commander of the Kidō Butai, the powerful naval air force of the Empire of Japan. He is in charge of invading and capturing Midway Atoll, the first step in a plan to lure the US carriers into a deadly trap. He did not obey the instructions from his commanding officer, Admiral Yamamoto, andwas now very close to losing the battle that he started. His decision to rearm his carrier strike team with land bombs put the lives of 97 other pilots at risk. Those men are on their way back to his ship from their first attack to rearm their aircrafts, and they plan to return to Midway for a second attack. However, he had just discovered that the US carriers which he was supposed to destroy, have discovered where he and the rest of the Kidō Butai are located. He needs to make a quick decision. Admiral Nagumo doesn't have the time or the capability to land and replenish the Midway strike team while launching his carrier strike team simultaneously. His carrier ship can do only one thing at a time. He has two choices: send an immediate attack with the wrong kind of armament and risk 97 planes running out of fuel and crashing, or wait until the Midway attack team had lands and are ready to fight the enemy all together properly.
