Title: “The Causes of Pearl Harbor”--January 17th “Hangar Talk” A Free Lecture at Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor

Honolulu, HI— Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor continues its monthly aviation presentation “Hangar Talk,” the third Saturday of each month, 1 to 2pm. The upcoming January 17th presentation will feature Jon Davidann, Ph.D., discussing “The Causes of Pearl Harbor & the Pacific War. Free with admission to the Museum.

Dr. Davidann is professor of history at Hawaii Pacific University and the author of several books including Cultural Diplomacy in U.S.-Japanese Relations, 1919~1941, and Hawaii at the Crossroads. His special expertise is U.S./Japanese relations in the 20th Century.

Each month, guest lecturers who are aviation authors, pilots, and World War II veterans discuss aviation and the history it made and changed. The series is held in the Pacific Aviation Museum Theatre with a question and answer session included.

Future “Hangar Talks” scheduled for Saturdays, 1pm, Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor, in the Theatre: February 21, March 21, and April 18, 2009. The museum’s restaurant, Laniakea Café, is open for lunch until 4:30pm.
