Living History Day Will Bring the People and Stories Alive At Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor August 10

Honolulu, HI--Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor will come alive with “pioneers” and “heroes” of the Pacific--walking and talking among the aircraft and exhibits, Saturday, August 10, 9am to 5pm. Sharing history in a talk story kind of format, visitors will be able to interact with costumed interpreters and storytellers from WWII, the Korean War, and the Vietnam era.

Living History Day will also feature Hawaii Military Vehicle Preservation Association vehicles in front of the hangars, and student history exhibits and multimedia presentations on “The Flying Tigers” by Kaiser High School students in the hangars. Guests can visit “The Spirit of ‘45” exhibit and help keep the spirit alive, explore the Museum’s more than 43 aircraft, plus enjoy

all exhibits and videos. The all-day events are free to Museum members and free with Museum admission.

A special book signing will be held in the lobby of Hangar 37 from 10:30 to 11:30am with noted aviator Captain Alex Kane, the author of *Now That's Livin'* and *Now That's Flyin'*. Both books are available for sale in the Museum Store. Born in Scotland and previously from New Zealand, Capt. Kane now resides in Hawaii.
