

## ON-SITE PROGRAM



**Program:** Historical Perspectives

**Grade Level:** 6<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> grade

**Group Size:** min. 15, max. 80

**Length:** 3 hours

**Location:** Pacific Aviation Museum Pearl Harbor

### Overview

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This field trip program teaches students about the pivotal first six months of World War II in the Pacific through the stories of those who experienced it. They also complete maneuvers on a flight simulator, examine the importance of designing and engineering for a specific job or mission, and complete an engineering challenge inspired by the first flight from California to Hawaii.

### Objectives

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- Understand the events surrounding the Pearl Harbor attack and their impact
- View historical events through the eyes of those who experienced it
- Explain the relationship between design and function in aircraft
- Learn about basic flight instruments and controls
- Use engineering design process to create and redesign a plane that meets specific characteristic
- Work collaboratively to complete a task
