July 23-29 – Sacrifice For Freedom: WWII In The Pacific: Middle and high school educators from across the United States will spend four days touring World War II historic sites on Oahu as part of an 18-month hands on program called *Understanding Sacrifice*, aimed at teaching educators about America’s role in the Pacific Theater of Operations during World War II. Teachers will spend two of those four days at Pearl Harbor Aviation Museum on historic Ford Island, the site where bombs fell during the Pearl Harbor attack on December 7, 1941.

Pearl Harbor Aviation Museum is located on Historic Ford Island, where bombs fell during the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941. Walk on the Pearl Harbor battlefield where the attack began, enter the bullet-scarred hangars, see the control tower and aircraft of the battle, including a Japanese Zero and the B-17 Swamp Ghost. Hear the stories of WWII heroes and their response to the attack that changed our nation and the world. Tour Included, flight simulators and café available.
