Lihue to Hilo



Captain Mokulele is flying from Līhue to Hilo. Along the way she must pick up and drop off passengers on the other Hawaiian Islands. <u>Calculate</u> how many passengers she has at the end of her trip.

At Līhue (Lee-hoo-eh), <u>87</u> passengers board the plane, bound for several other island destinations. When they land in busy Honolulu (Hoh-noh-loo-loo), <u>32</u> passengers depart and <u>16</u> passengers board. In Hoʻolehua (Hoh-oh-leh-hoo-ah), <u>2</u> passengers depart and <u>6</u> passengers board the airplane. The head to Kahului (Kah-hoo-loo-wee), the second most populated island, where <u>56</u> passengers depart and <u>37</u> passengers board. In Lānaʻi City (Lah-nah-ee), <u>0</u> passengers depart and only <u>1</u> passenger boards. And finally in Hilo (Hee-loh), all of the remaining passengers depart.

There are no passengers left on the airplane.
