



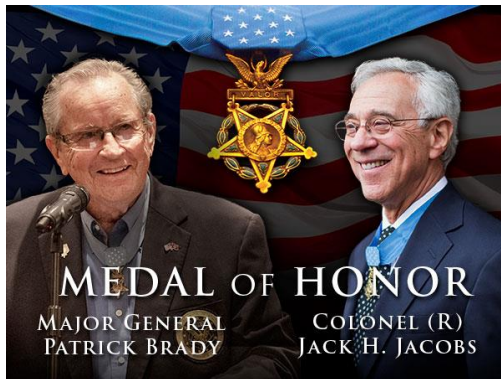

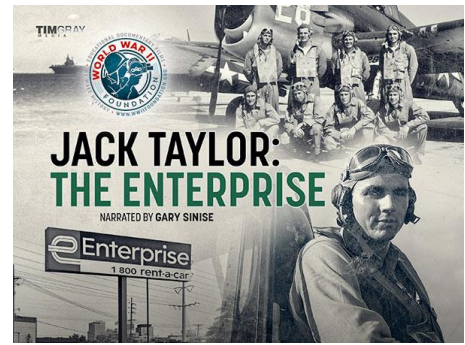
December 3, 2022 11 a.m. – Q&A with Vietnam Medal of Honor Recipients

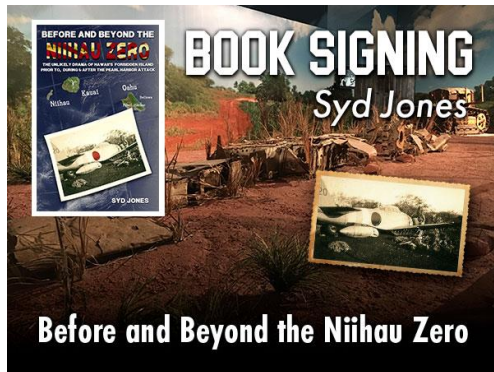

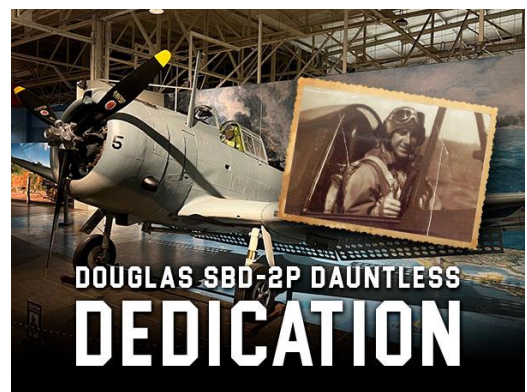

December 7, 2022 1:00 p.m. – Douglas SBD-2P Dauntless Restoration Presentation and Dedication of Aircraft

Before the Museum’s Douglas SBD-2P Dauntless was put on display in our hangar, it was at the bottom of Lake Michigan. On December 7, 1:00 p.m. Kalamazoo Air Zoo president, Fred Turner and Dr. Arthur Lendo, nephew of the last pilot of our SBD will tell the story of how our aircraft, submerged under water, made its way back to life with the amazing restoration work of the Air Zoo team. A dedication ceremony of our SBD will follow in Hangar 37. Light refreshments will be provided.





December 8, 2022 11:30 a.m. – Nakajima B5N “Kate” and Type 91 Torpedo Presentation

Charlie “Sid” Gillman, former Navy aviator and retired Capt. shares his findings and research on the Nakajima B5N “Kate” Bomber, one of the three Japanese aircraft used in the bombing of Pearl Harbor. His presentation, on December 8, 11:30 a.m., will address the myths and Hollywood-like mindset of the Kate and its torpedo. He will cover a number of topics surrounding the Kate and her torpedo – what

was her mission, how was the torpedo used, how did the three-man crew communicate to each other. He’ll take us into the cockpit and in the mind of the pilot and his crew.
